The Sheet Metal Trade

Sheet metal workers fabricate, assemble, and install a variety of sheet metal products. Typical jobs performed by a sheet metal worker include HVAC (heating, ventilation and air conditioning) ductwork, and industrial sheet metal work. They also work on hospital and kitchen equipment (stainless steel), industrial exhaust systems, residential sheet metal work, architectural, roofing and flashing (copper, aluminum, stainless steel and galvanized iron).

The Program

This is a 23 week program. This includes two weeks of life skills, twenty weeks of technical training in the BCIT sheet metal shop at the Burnaby campus, and one week of employment preparation. Life skills and employment preparation will take place off campus. This is a full time program. Normal hours are 7:30 to 3:30.

Checklist for Eligibility

- Must have successfully completed grade 10.
- Have exceptional math skills.
- Must be under employment or not eligible for EI.
- Must be living in Vancouver, Richmond or North Vancouver.
- Be reliable and willing to attend school every day.
- Have a keen interest in completing a four year apprenticeship program.
